<u>Racing Format</u>: Equal Opportunity Racing System - EORS. Race committee will determine number of races daily considering weather, course and equipment conditions. To constitute national regatta, eight races must be completed for US VMYG V36s and VM championships.

Scoring: Racing will use Low-Point Scoring system; Appendix A of Racing Rules of Sailing. For each eight races sailed, each participant will be allowed one throw-out race plus one point to be added for any DNFs and DNSs.

<u>**Prizes</u>**: Trophies to Top-Three in V36 Nationals. Traditional and High Flyer design categories Top-Three awards for VM Nationals and Bithell Regatta. Chowder/Messenger Cup awards are Under & Over 40-Inch fleets for AMYA and V36/VM models. Perpetual Bithell Cup to High Flyer VM fleet winner in 2018. Perpetual Messenger Cup in 2018 will be awarded to largest Over 40-Inch fleet design turnout / high finisher who is MMYC member.</u>

<u>Measurements</u>: Measurement and class authenticity verification maybe randomly conducted during check-in and registration as determined by the respective Regatta Director.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR V36/VM REGATTAS ENTRY FORM (Page 3) Skippers & Guests

1) Fill-out design name / sail# for V36 and VM models entered. If more than one model, enter other design name and sail# on second row of Entry and include extra \$15 fee for second boat.

2) Include email for the latest news; e.g., Local Sailing Instructions and schedule changes. Also check MMYC website under "2018 Mini-Race Week" for US VMYG National Championships (2) + MMYC Bithell Cup VM Regatta, and Chowder/Messenger Cup Regatta.

3) US VMYG <u>Skipper basic V36/VM entry is \$60</u> with two onsite lunches (Thu-Fri). Include guests lunches at \$10 each. Guest costs added to \$60 for total fee. <u>Bithell VM regatta fee is \$25 plus guest</u> <u>lunches at \$10 each</u>: Top Three finishers in TR and HF VM designs get awards. If skipper races in V36 and VM Nationals plus Bithell VM Cup, total entry fee is \$85 not including guest lunches.

4) MMYC Chowder Race/Messenger Cup Skipper **entry is \$25** to include a Sunday lunch. Lunches are wrapped sandwiches Thu/Fri, pizza Saturday, and traditional chowder/beans & franks Sunday.

6) US VMYG Skippers add all fees (entries + guest lunches) to provide amount in "Total Fee Due" box for V36/VM and Bithell entries. For V36/VM M Nationals and Bithell VM regattas, checks payable to "John Snow" with Entry and remittance sent to John. The "Bill Bithell" Cup VM Regatta annually recognizes Bill's 75 years in our sport from 1932 to 2006. He launched his career at Redd's Pond at 1932 free-sail regatta with his first scratchbuilt model: the M 50-800. Bill was championship skipper, master scratch-builder, sail-maker and fittings supplier, and valued mentor.

Skippers need to contact RD John Snow by October 17 to confirm entry and R/C frequency by VM design – Traditional (TR: 1930-1945) and High Flyer (HF: 1946-1970) models. "Top Three" TR and HF skippers get plaques with HF champion also awarded the perpetual Bithell Cup. (*\$5 of the entry fee goes to pond fund to control weeds.) NOR entry form will also be distributed for the club's annual Chowder Race on Sunday, October 21, through Craig Speck: 617-650-2342. Thus, VM skippers will have option for full slate of weekend racing under New England's colorful fall-foliage.

Awards will be given to overall winner of the fleet and the Messenger cup will be awarded per below: The **Traveling Marblehead MYC 1934 "Messenger Cup"** will be awarded to the winner of the largest class in the **"over-40 fleet in even years** or to the largest fleet in the **"under-40" fleet in odd years**. This award is **limited to MMYC members**.

We recommend using street maps from YAHOO: <u>http://maps.yahoo.com/</u> Redd's Pond is located at 4 Norman Street in Marblehead, MA 01945.

From North of Boston

- Use Interstate 95 S to MA Rte 128 to Salem/Gloucester.
- Take Rte 114 S (Exit 25E off 128) through Salem into Marblehead (6.5 miles). Carefully follow signs for all turns. Rte 114 becomes Lafayette St in center of Salem into Marblehead. You enter Marblehead after passing Salem State University on right and then crossing small bridge with Salem harbor on left.
- Turn left onto West Shore Drive at second traffic light after entering Marblehead.
- Continue about 3 miles until Redd's Pond appears on left. Road changes to Beacon and Norman streets at some points and winds through wooded residential section. Keep going until you see pond on left next to boatyard.

From West of Boston

- From Mass Pike (Interstate 90) take I-95 N to Salem/Gloucester. Follow signs to Salem via Rte 128 (do not continue on I-95 north to New Hampshire).
- Take Rte 114 S (Exit 25E off 128), through Salem into Marblehead (6.5 miles). Carefully follow signs for all turns. Rte 114 becomes Lafayette St in center of Salem into Marblehead. You enter Marblehead after passing Salem State College on right and then crossing small bridge with Salem harbor on left.
- Turn left onto West Shore Drive at second traffic light after entering Marblehead.
- Continue about 3 miles until Redd's Pond appears on left. Road changes to Beacon and Norman streets at some points and winds through wooded residential section. Keep going until you see pond on left next to boatyard.

From South

- From Boston take Rte 1A through Revere crossing over General Edwards Bridge into Lynn. Bear right at traffic light about 1.4 miles after bridge into Lynn. Follow signs for Nahant and Swampscott. **Do not turn left into Lynn on Rte 1A.**
- Continue around rotary and use signs directing you to Swampscott and Marblehead along shore drive. **Do not take first right to Nahant** at rotary. Ocean will be on right after exiting rotary.
- From rotary in Lynn, road becomes Humphrey St in Swampscott and changes to Atlantic Ave as it takes you into Marblehead. At forks take straightest paths.
- Continue from Lynn rotary for about 4.3 miles to bend left (Marblehead Bank on left) on Atlantic Ave in Marblehead. Continue straight through five-corner intersection just after passing bank. Road then changes to Essex St at intersection
- Bear left after passing Town "Information" booth onto Spring St at stop sign. Leave small mall with "Starbucks" on left.
- Continue on Spring St about 0.3 miles, which bends right and changes to Elm St. At Green St, jog left and then take immediate right onto Pond St and drive to pond about 0.3 mile.
